Dear Eucharist Preparation Families,

The people of Ascension welcome you and your child to this year of preparation for the reception of First Eucharist. This is a grace-filled time for you and for the Ascension community. We are grateful for the opportunity to work with your family during this time and we pledge our support.

The Eucharist is “the source and summit of the entire Christian life” (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, n.11). The Eucharist is also the culmination of the Sacraments of Initiation. Preparation for the Eucharist is, first, the primary privilege and responsibility of the parents, and then of the Community. Children are generally prepared for their participation in the Eucharist around the age of seven. The program used by Ascension Parish is based on Christiane Brusselman’s *We Celebrate the Eucharist*. The program centers on the family, parish and worshipping community. It recognizes that “the initiation of children takes place step-by-step in the community of the faithful.” It also acknowledges that parents have a special role in the process of their children’s initiation.

Preparation for First Eucharist includes five sessions during the year involving both parents and children. The Church strongly encourages adult education and formation. Parent meetings during years of sacramental preparation offer an excellent opportunity for adults to renew their own understanding of the sacrament. Through prayer, conversation, reflection, and sharing ideas, adults increase and broaden their knowledge and deepen their appreciation of the meaning of Eucharist. Fr. McNally strongly recommends that parents preparing their first child for Eucharist attend the parent meeting and all other meetings with their children.

Parents and children work together--at home and at the evening sessions--to come to a deeper understanding of each of the nine themes presented in the program. Each theme offers a different perspective on the meaning of the Eucharist. As a whole they give a very broad understanding of this sacrament.

The parish preparation for Eucharist begins in October. The celebration of First Eucharist takes place on the first two weekends in May (May 5-6 and May 12-13). Parents may choose one of the four Masses at which they will celebrate their child’s reception of First Eucharist.

First Eucharist Preparation Sessions

October 5, 2011	Parent meeting (For First Time Parents, returning parents are always welcome)	7:30-9:00 PM	Pine Room
	Only parents who have never worked with the Gold Book for First Eucharist preparation need attend this meeting. During this session, parents receive information about the Eucharist preparation program and suggestions for how to work with their children in the home setting. It is also an opportunity for parents to discuss their own understanding of the Eucharist and to receive some updating regarding the theology of the sacrament. We welcome parents who have been through the program before to share your knowledge and insights.		
October 17, 2011	Enrollment ceremony (Parents and children)	7-8 PM	Church
	At this service the children are presented with a copy of <u>We Celebrate the Eucharist</u> . The children sign their names on an enrollment banner and the community of parents and children pray together at the beginning of this special year of preparation.		
February 1, 2012	Prayer Service (Parent and child)	7-8 PM	Church
	This session provides an opportunity for the children to explore some of the objects used during Mass. Through presentations on the signs and gestures of the Liturgy the children are invited to enter into the great mysteries of our faith. Parents can use what they learn at this session to help their children focus more specifically on various parts of the Mass.		
March 19, 2012	Peace Service (Parent and child)	7-8 PM	Church
	This session focuses on the theme of Reconciliation. The children and parents have an opportunity to reflect on God's love and mercy, pray together during an examination of conscience and, if they choose, they may speak with a priest in individual reconciliation. Together we thank God for the gift of forgiveness and ask God's help in forgiving others.

May 5, 2012	Celebration of First Eucharist	11:00 AM Mass

May 13, 2012	Celebration of First Eucharist	11:00 AM Mass
